# RUBY VALLEY TREATY CONFERENCE EVENT PRESENTERS 2024



Tanaya Winder Keynote

"Words as Seeds: Healing Our Communities with Lateral Kindness." How do words shape and mold us into the people we become? When we think of words as seeds, we become even more aware of the intention behind words that are planted with positivity and those that cause harm. Indigenous storyteller Tanaya Winder will offer testimony on the power of words and their impact on our spirit's traumas and triumphs. This walk through a garden of a lifetime of seeds planted both in her lifetime and intergenerationally will illuminate struggles of seeds that never blossomed and the celebration of the seeds that burst through barriers. Discover how you can overcome obstacles, and turn struggle, pain, and wounds into power



Autumn Harry Keynote

"Numu Place Names: Retention & Reclamation." This research examines how place name knowledge has been passed down generationally within the ancestral homelands of the Kooyooe Tukadu (Cui-ui Eaters) from Kooyooe Pa'a Panunadu (Pyramid Lake, Nevada) and how this knowledge contributes to the retention and reclamation of Numu place names. Numu place name knowledge systems are actively being reclaimed on the individual and community level and can further expand by returning names to the land, increasing Numu-centered mapping approaches, and speaking Numu yadooa in our ancestral homelands.

"An Illustration of Current Environmental Complexities in the Great Basin." This session will focus on real land projects and federal and state policy in Nevada and how those projects and policy may impact Great Basin Native Americans.



Robbie Burroughs

"The Pine Creek Ranch Project." The Pine Creek Ranch Project is powered by NDN Collective, an indigenous nonprofit organization. The main intention of this project is centered around LANDBACK to local indigenous peoples and communities. This is an amazing opportunity to build community, foster relationships and contribute to social empowerment. We will share updates about this local project and can talk more about the many ways of LANDBACK.



**"US v. Dann in the Modern Era."** Timeline of Supreme Court precedent and legal think tank on gradual encroachment. Personal insight into impacts and legacy of Mary and Carrie Dann's work on indigenous rights.

"Treaties and Restorative Justice: Bending the Arc of Justice into a Circle." A treaty is an agreed-upon understanding between two or more sovereign peoples to maintain mutual relations. Treaties outline what each party expects from the other. With this understanding, Native nations, like the Noowuh and the Očhéthi Šakówiŋ Oyáte, have negotiated treaties with settlers, yet Native people and settlers have not maintained mutual relations. Too often, treaty-based disputes between settlers and Native nations are resolved in settler courts. The restorative justice (RJ) framework offers an alternative to resolving what appear to be intractable Native-Settler disputes. This presentation introduces how restorative justice provides another approach to understanding and resolving treaty-based disputes.



"History and Current Participation at the United Nations." The 1894 Sioux Nation Treaty Council delegates have participated at the United Nations since 1982. We see this venue as the only way for full enforcement of our Fort Laramie Treaty of 1868, and the continuation of our nation as a nation. Currently the United States is illegally trespassing in our Treaty Territory.

**"Textural Painting."** One session for adults and one session for the youth: learn how to apply techniques and layers of paint to overcome a blank canvas. You will creates layers of color and texture, experimenting with techniques and then create a final image to be your main focal point of your work.



Tanaya Winder Keynote

Heartspeak: Writing to Reconnect with Yourself." Heartspeak helps us connect with ourselves in ways that remind us of our heart's desires, our purpose and life calling. Writing/journaling in this way is a helpful and reflective skill that serves as a means of processing trauma, joys, or anything that comes in between. Join renowned Indigenous poet, author, and motivational speaker Tanaya Winder as she weaves resilience and empowerment into her storytelling and writing exercises. This interactive session will offer writing prompts to help you tap into parts of your journey that need reexamination, compassion, and uplifting. Taking time to write and reflect provides us with meaningful space to reconnect with our goals and purpose in an intentional and mindful way. You will learn how to incorporate heartspeak and seeds of purpose into your everyday practices. You do not have to be a "writer" to attend as this is a session meant for grounding in the power of pause, presence, and reflection.

"Talking Circle for Everyone." The talking circle is a place where all people meet to discuss what is in their hearts and on their minds, regarding their feelings about themselves and others.

"When Nothing Works: Somatics for Navigating the Impossible." Somatic = the felt sense of the body. When our personal and interpersonal realities become so challenging that we're facing the impossible, somatic tools can empower us to find new ways of understanding and transforming reality. This workshop will begin with an introduction to working with trauma and healing from a community somatics perspective and will end with a short guided somatic practice. When cultural and ancestral wounds are overwhelming our communities, we need tools and support that can meet us in these impossible landscapes. Can we be curious about what it might look like to find mutual support as we begin creating conditions together for healing? Through our explorations, we could aim to find stability for ourselves and our communities. Even when complex trauma is endlessly looping, our curiosity can open new pathways and new possibilities that weren't available before.

**"Nature Day Play Shop: Exploring with Ease for 3-10yr olds."** The Nature Day Playshop will have playful movement, songs, stories and artistic activities to encourage the children. We will listen to our senses and how we feel. When students feel relative safety they are able to be curious and being curious is a portal to learning and revealing connections. The playshop will have activities to support a sense of exploration into the natural world as well as the children's imagination. These activities are designed to lift feelings of self worth and inherent goodness that can expand to community care. In the playshop we will also share some techniques and exercises help to bring balance and resilience so curiosity and ease can emerge.


